

WACA 56th AGA: The 2025 Interline Celebration



The 56th Annual General Assembly (AGA) of the World Airlines Clubs Association (WACA) will be held from 1–5 October 2025 at the Radisson Blu Resort in St. Julian's, Malta, hosted by WACA.

Malta was chosen for its commitment to the same themes as WACA: sustainability and responsible tourism as well as its history, culture and scenic beauty. Its history is related to a succession of rulers and it is considered to have the most UNESCO heritage locations in terms of its size.





OUR DESTINATION — MALTA



Small in size yet intriguing in various themes, Malta's history and culture is influenced by many different occupants who lived on the islands throughout the years.

The Maltese islands went through a golden Neolithic period the remains of which include the mysterious temples dedicated to the goddess of fertility. Later on, the Phoenicians, the Carthaginians, the Romans and the Byzantines, all left their traces on the islands.

St. Paul brought Christianity to Malta when he was shipwrecked on the island in 60 A.D.

In 1798, Napoleon Bonaparte took over Malta from the Knights on his way to Egypt. The French presence on the islands were short lived, as the English, who were requested by the Maltese to help them against the French, blockaded the islands in 1800. British rule in Malta lasted until 1964 when Malta became independent. The Maltese adopted the British system of public administration, education and legislation.

Malta became a Republic in 1974, and the foreign military bases on the island closed down permanently in 1979. Malta joined the European Union in May 2004 and the Eurozone in January 2008.





Flights – The Maltese Islands are serviced by an extensive network of international flight connections which are under three hours flying time from major European gateways.

Communications – Maltese and English are the Official languages in Malta. Most locals speak both these languages, while many also speak a third language.

Climate – With almost 300 days of sunshine a year, and mild temperatures throughout autumn and winter, this Mediterranean island offers many possibilities throughout the year.

Diversity – While the Maltese islands are a famous sun and sea destination, they are also rich in history, culture, action and nightlife, creating a unique variety of offerings on such a small island.

Day 1 – 1 October 2025

PROGRAMME

Full Day Excursion to Gozo

Morning

- Early breakfast at the Resort.
- Depart from the Resort at 8:00 a.m. to Cirkewwa Ferry Terminal.
- Enjoy a scenic ferry ride (approximately 25 minutes) to Gozo, Malta's sister island known for its rural charm and dramatic landscapes.

Activities in Gozo

- Visit the Cittadella and its Visitor Centre, exploring the historic fortifications and museums.
- Stop at the Archaeological Museum to delve into Gozo's ancient history.
- Discover the stunning **Dwejra** site, including the Inland Sea.
- Relax and take a short stroll at **Xlendi Bay**, a picturesque coastal area.
- Enjoy lunch at a traditional Gozitan restaurant.
- Visit the **Ggantija Temples**, one of the oldest freestanding structures in the world and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Evening

- Return ferry to Malta.
- Arrive at the Resort by 7:00 p.m.
- Dinner at leisure at the Resort's main restaurant or enjoy room service.







Day 3 – 3 October 2025

Malta City Tour – Valletta and Surroundings

Morning

- Breakfast at the Resort.
- Depart at 9:00 a.m. for a guided tour of Valletta, Malta's historic capital and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Tour Highlights

- **Upper Barrakka Gardens.** Panoramic views of the Grand Harbour and the iconic Three Cities.
- **St. John's Co-Cathedral.** Marvel at its baroque architecture and the world famous Caravaggio paintings.

Afternoon

- · Lunch in town.
- A panoramic tour of Valletta, followed by some free time for shopping or exploring at leisure.
- En route back to the Resort, make a brief stop in **Birgu** (Vittoriosa), one of the Three Cities, for a glimpse of its charming narrow streets and historic sites.

Evening

- Return to the Resort by 5:00 p.m.
- Dinner at the Resort followed by the Regional Night.

Date: 1-5 October 2025.

Cost: USD 1,150.00 per person based on double occupancy (USD 1,100.00 if paid in full by 31 March). Single

occupancy supplement USD 400.00.

Capacity: 70 rooms. Registrations will be confirmed on a first come, first served, basis.

Registration Deadline: 15 June 2025.

Payments: a deposit of USD 400.00 per participant is required to be confirmed on the package.

Regretfully, WACA does not have the capability to accept payments by credit card. Payment by PayPal is also not an option due to the high service charge incurred.

Note: deposits are subject to a USD 50.00 cancellation fee up to 1 June 2025. No deposit will be refunded after that date.
